- No-one wants to think about the unthinkable but it is important that schools
 have measures in place to deal with unwanted visitors either on the school
 grounds or within the school buildings. This week, we have reviewed our
 PREVENT procedures and have a clear system in place should the worst happen.

EXCITING NEWS!

We have made plans for the children to take part in the Derby Faith Trail. This will provide an exciting opportunity for the children to learn about other faiths and cultures

- THANK YOU for helping to sharpen up our start to the day! There has been a
 very noticeable reduction in the number of late arrivals WELL DONE
 EVERYONE! Just as a reminder:
 - School gates open at 8.50am and close at 9am.
 - o All children need to be in class by 9am.
 - o Registers will then close at 9.10am.
 - If you arrive after 9am, you will need to bring your child to the school office to avoid any disruption to learning that will have already started.
 - If you arrive after 9am but before 9.10am, your child will be marked as LATE on the register.
 - If you arrive after 9.10am, your child will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

- LATES and unauthorised absence are picked up during register health checks carried out by Education Welfare.
- Another THANK YOU for making sure that we can claim to be a HEALTHY school. Most children this week have come to school with drinking water in their bottles and have also brought a healthy snack. Please ensure that as NUT FREE Zones and schools which promote healthy eating, water bottles only contain water (no flavoured water please) and that snacks are limited to either a piece of fruit or a cereal bar. Please ensure that the snack does not contain any nuts.
- This week I have reviewed policies and procedures in order to manage ASTHMA. If your child is already on our Asthma register, you will receive a letter asking you to update us on your child's Asthma status. Clear procedures are in place to ensure the safety and welfare of your child. Please ensure that school inhalers are kept up to date and that we have got a spacer to use with your child.
- We have looked MUCH smarter this week and most children have arrived at school ready to learn, wearing the agreed uniform. THANK YOU for supporting us with this. Can I clarify that PE kit during these colder months should be:
 - White t-shirt
 - Black shorts
 - Black sweatshirt/jogging bottoms/plain, warm black leggings
 - Suitable footwear
- This week, we have put procedures in place to keep you informed about your child's attendance and also to manage attendance that drops below our school target of 96%. Your child will be bringing home a letter today which informs you of your child's attendance this academic year to date, ie. from September 2022 to last week. You will notice that there are three attendance bands - GREEN for attendance within 96 - 100%, AMBER for attendance 90 - 95.9% and RED for attendance below 90%. You will be updated at the end of each half term. As our next holiday is only two weeks away, your next attendance report will be just before the Easter break. I hope that you find this information useful in helping your child to maintain GREEN attendance. Don't forget, we can manage headaches and sniffly noses in school so always try to send your child if at all possible. Don't forget that in the case of vomiting and diarrhoea, your youngster will need to remain off school for 48 hours from the LAST episode to ensure that they are completely clear. Each newsletter will inform you of the class with the best attendance for the week and also the whole school attendance figure for the week.
- I am still receiving some requests for HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME. Please note that leave of absence will not be granted for holidays during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Amendments to the Education Regulations

- 2006 removed references to family holidays as well as the threshold of ten school days and the criteria is now extremely tight. Where unapproved holidays are taken during term time, it is likely that a PENALTY NOTICE will be issued.
- I have noticed that we are establishing much clearer lines of communication.
 Please can I ask that in the first instance you:
 - Speak to the class teacher if it is a class-based issue or ask the school office to arrange for the class teacher to give you a call.
 - If the class teacher is not able to resolve the issue or you are not happy with the outcome, then speak to me or drop me an email and I will do everything I can to sort out the problem.
 - o If you are not happy with the outcome having spoken to me, then your next step would be to formally raise the issue with our Governing Body who will then look into the matter for you. Please remember that no Governor can be involved in managing your issue or complaint if they have prior knowledge of your issue.
- Please remember that if earrings are worn, this should be a small, plain stud.
 Please remember to remove earrings on PE days. Don't forget that we are not allowed to remove earrings for safeguarding reasons. If you are considering having your youngster's ears pierced, please consider that this is done in the summer holiday as earrings cannot be removed from newly pierced ears for several weeks. In the same way, in line with our uniform policy, hair must be tied back and no jewellery is permitted.
- You will notice that the music of the week is Radetzky March by J. Strauss. Try
 listening to this one without feeling the need to clap along! Help your youngster
 to watch a YouTube video clip try and find one which shows an orchestra.
 Alternatively ask Alexa to play it for you. There's a Dojo waiting for anyone who
 can find out one fact about the music or the composer!
