 Don't forget that the price of a school meal is increasing after the Easter break. The meal price from April 2024 will increase from £2.83p to £2.95p per meal.

Don't forget, under our new DEBT POLICY, your services may be suspended if you have an outstanding balance with no payment plan in place to clear the debt.

- The warmer weather is creeping in and we will soon be in the summer term.
 Please ensure that your child comes to school each day with their water bottle.
 Water bottles are kept in the classroom and the children are able to freely access them as they wish.
- After the Easter break, children are invited to change over into summer uniform should they wish to do so. Please ensure that your child's summer uniform is in line with our uniform guidance on the school website. Also, during the break, please check all items of uniform and make sure that they are clearly named this is the time of year when jumpers and cardigans start to come off and can easily become lost if the item isn't named.

PLEASE REMEMBER that we are a NUT-FREE SCHOOL. Nut products coming into school poses a real risk to the children that we have who suffer from NUT ALLERGIES. Please check that any food sent into school adheres to our NUT-FREE policy.

PLEASE REMEMBER - If you are considering having your youngster's ears
pierced, please consider that this is done in the summer holiday as earrings
cannot be removed from newly pierced ears for at least 6 weeks and this
will result in them having to miss at least 12 PE lessons. In the same way,
in line with our uniform policy, hair must be tied back and no jewellery is
permitted with the exception of PLAIN STUD earrings.

READING AT HOME - Please try to read with your child every day. When you read with your child, please write in the reading diary or for the older children, support them in writing in the diary themselves. Please ensure that your child's reading book and diary is in school every day. Reading every day makes a REAL DIFFERENCE!

I have set a target for the children that they read at home AT LEAST THREE TIMES A WEEK. This can be any form of reading! Diaries will be checked each Friday to monitor home reading.
